New Year, New Term



INFANT CLASS NEWS

Dear Families

Welcome back to school. We hope that you had a lovely Christmas and New Year. This Spring term we would like to welcome some new additions to the infant class. We are pleased to say that Mrs Dean and Mrs Buckee have joined the infant team for this term. They will be supporting and working with children in the classroom and we are very happy to welcome them. We must also welcome back Miss Foster, our Exeter University student who will be with us until nearly Easter so we are very lucky that the Infants will have lots of adult support this term.

This spring term our topic is 'Pirates and Islands'.

In History we will be looking at how pirates lived, and what life on board ship was like. We'll meet some pirates from the past and make lots of art and craft to do with pirates and their treasure.

In Science we are looking at the seasons and the weather. The children will be finding out why we have four seasons and some countries do not. We'll look at the weather and record the weather in a scientific way.

For RE we will be looking at New Beginnings and also the festivals of Holi and the Chinese New year. In maths the children will be continuing to develop their skills in calculation, measures and shape. They will be using facts that they have learned to help solve problems.

In Literacy the children will be writing stories with familiar settings, stories with fantasy settings, poetry, instructions and recounts.

If you have any artefacts, pictures, books or a particular interest in any of our topics we would love see them or you.

Notices for this term:

Please could all children bring in a warm coat every day, as we like to get fresh air as much as we can, even in cold weather. Children should also have sensible black or dark shoes/boots as part of their school uniform.

Please could all children have a sensible pair of PE shoes in their PE bags. Ideally trainers are best for most sessions but plimsolls will do if getting trainers is difficult. The children will also need a PE t-shirt, shorts and leggings or tracksuit bottoms for outdoor work. You may put in a sweater for outside but they can wear their school jumper. Please send in bookbags daily for reading and notices. Any questions please don't hesitate to speak to the office or Mrs Yarney.

Homework will be sent home again this week, and we will be giving the children a word or language homework (which may be spellings but not every week) and a maths focus. These will usually be sent home on a Thursday to be completed by the following Thursday.

This term Year two will be getting a **personal project** focus, which they can complete over the course of the half term, to be handed in on Monday 24th February. Awards will be given for projects that have had lots of effort put into them.

We look forward to seeing you over the coming term. Please don't hesitate to come and chat to staff if you have any questions or concerns.

JUNIOR NEWS

Hello and welcome back

I hope you all had an enjoyable Christmas.

The spring term is quite short so we have a lot to fit into our weeks. First of all, we welcome Julia McKelvey back to the junior class for the remainder of her teaching practice with us.

Heatree residential is coming up in March. For those of you who are new to Heatree, there will be more information closer to the time. If you have any questions or worries about your child coming on a residential then please come and talk me. Every year, all the children have a great time and can't wait to go back.

In literacy this term, we are studying fictional writing. This includes fantasy, science fiction and mystery. We are going to link this to our topic by going time travelling! For the remainder of the term, we will focus on non fiction texts, including, reports, persuasion and autobiographies.

In maths we are beginning the term with number work looking at reasoning about numbers, decimals, related facts and multiples and factors. We will then move on to calculation strategies, both mentally and written, for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will continue with daily times tables practice. In science, the topic this term is the earth, the solar system and light. We will be looking at the importance of the sun in our solar system, how the moon orbits the earth, learning some of the names of our stars and also finding out about how our eyes work.

As you probably know, our topic this term is prehistory, including up to the stone age. We will study the early origins of man and how the world has changed over that time, including the ice age. We will look at the evidence for that period of history and how it has taught us about early man. We will find out what life was like in the stone age and compare it to our lives now!

Through art we will continue with our topic theme. Julia is an art specialist, so will be completing a unit of work on cave art with the children, experimenting with natural materials and a variety of techniques.

RE this term will focus on signs and symbols across the faiths and what they represent.

Swimming will continue until the very end of term with one week off during Heatree week. Games will continue to be on Wednesday, beginning with football. Due to the time of year, this can be weather dependent. It may be necessary to change day or move inside, so all children should have their kit in school at the start of the week. A warm set of joggers and jumper (that you don't mind getting muddy) will be a good idea. Please remember that earrings need to be removed or covered.

Our first session on a Wednesday has now changed. Miss McKelvey will be taking German and Mrs Mulligan will be taking recorders. The children will be allowed to bring their recorders home to practise (sorry!) but they do need to be back in every Wednesday.

A few notices now; booster for year six will begin next Tuesday afternoon, run by Claire. This will take over as their homework until May. If you have any questions about this just ask. For the rest of the class, homework will continue to be given out on Thursday and returned the following Wednesday; long hair needs to be tied up please; every child needs to have a warm coat in school, every day please.

As always, if have any concerns or questions, just pop into class in the morning to speak to one of us.

We all look forward to seeing you at one of our events after half term.
