Hello all.



INFANT CLASS NEWS

Dear families,

We hope you had a lovely Easter. We are looking forward to a fun filled summer term. Our topic this term is 'Plants and growth'. The children will be learning about the parts of a plant and how plants grow, also the many different plants and animals that we can find in our local environment.

We are inviting the children to bring in pictures of their gardens or plants at home so that we can put them up on display. We will return these at the end of the term. Please write your child's name on the back of your photo so that it gets home safely. (If any budding gardeners out there have some spare bedding plants to share then we would be very grateful. We'd like the children to experience as many different plants as possible.)

In our Art we will be looking at the paintings of Georgia O'Keeffe and how she painted flowers and natural objects. Later in the term the children will be taking part in an Art Week and we shall let you know the details closer to the time.

Our History and Geography topics are based on where our food comes from. We shall be looking at the voyage of Christopher Columbus and the discovery of the West Indies. We'll also be looking at the journey of chocolate across the world as well as other foods that we know today.

Our Literacy will be a range of texts from 'traditional tales', information texts, recounts and stories with familiar settings. Our Maths will be a mixture of calculation, shape, space and measure, data handling, time and money.

PE: All children will need a full PE kit for this term. This should include, shorts, t-shirt (school PE t-shirt preferably) some warmer leggings or track suit bottoms and PE shoes. Trainers are the best thing for running on the field and in the playground. We will be taking part in Sports Day and other sporting activities throughout the term, as well as dance every week so children will need PE kits to take part. If you have any problems then please contact Mrs Yarney or Miss Williams. Long hair will need to be tied up out of the way.

Please could I ask parents to remind their children to only bring in a small toy from home. Our classroom is quite small and it soon fills up with bigger toys. I have asked the children to only bring in a toy if it can fit in their tray and nothing precious or important in case of breakages. One toy per child please.

We look forward to catching up with everyone over the coming term. If you have any questions or concerns please come in and see us.

JUNIOR NEWS

Hello and welcome to the summer term. I hope you all had an enjoyable and relaxing break over Easter.

In the junior class this term, we have a final teaching practice student, Emily Jones. Emily has settled in quickly and the children are already enjoying the literacy lessons on story writing, she has taken so far. She will be working with us until July, so you will have a chance to meet her throughout the term.

As you know, year 6 SATS and optional SATS (years 3, 4 and 5) will be taking place the week commencing the 12th May. We have been revising the maths curriculum we have studied so far this year and have been practising the types of questions the children will encounter in the tests. These tests are nothing for the children to worry about. They just form part of our end of year

assessment. During that week, the children will be able to undertake a research and fact file creation project on whatever subject they wish to. This can be something for the children to think about over the coming week so they are ready to start their project on the Monday of that week. This project can be on anything that interests them, as long as they know enough about it through research or books from home or the school library. We will also be completing a version of Batik art work on rivers that week

We have started our topic on rivers for the term. We will be looking at the course of the river, geographical processes, flooding, local and worldwide rivers. Through science, we will look at the water cycle and river habitats. We are hoping to have a field trip towards the end of term to a river location.

In RE, the children are comparing Christian and Buddhist creation stories and beliefs and how they influence their everyday lives. For PHSE, we are looking at feelings; what makes us happy and how to deal with bad feelings.

In PE we have started work on track and field events, preparing for sports day, and cricket skills.
