# From the Head

### Hello all.

Welcome to the summer term. Well what a beautiful start to the season (well the end of spring actually!). In light of this "using what you have learnt" becomes a key skill and that will be a focus for us in assemblies and many lessons. ### Exmoor Challenge

Our teams of year sixes have been training hard for the Exmoor challenge which takes place on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> May. Last Saturday we completed 12 miles of the course in beautiful conditions and all did extremely well. We have now selected the three teams (made up of children from across the federation) that will take part on the day. I must say a huge thank you to Graham Turner, Joe Brock and all the other parents for helping with the practice walks. Good luck to the teams and we will be there on the day following their progress.

### **Term events**

This term has many fun events for us all to look forward to. We have some summer sport fixtures and festivals (weather depending), Oceanfest, life skills, trips and theme days, our fabulous sports day and fete, as well as open afternoon, parent's evening and the leaver's assembly. The year sixes will be also be preparing for their transition to South Molton. This term we will also be supporting local events such as the Anstey Open Gardens Event and the village Fete. #### Tests

This is the half term where many children take National tests or school versions of them. These tests form only one of the ways that we assess our children and we emphasise that children should not get stressed about them. We remind them to simply try their best and never to panic about them. If you do have concerns about the tests or how children are preparing for them, do not hesitate to contact me at school.

#### New Curriculum and Levels

The national tests may be taking place for year 2 and year 6 (with phonics tests for year 1) but year 2 and year 6 are the only groups to still be given levels. With the arrival of the new national curriculum and the removal of the old level system you may notice a change in the way that the school measures how your child is doing. The new national curriculum works on an "age related" system - broadly whether they are on track for their age. All children will be measured against this system from next year. This is an exciting time for us in school as we are now able to extend our curriculum to enhance opportunities. Much more on this soon as we formally launch the new Exmoor Link Curriculum later this term.

### Summer weather

Summer is (almost) here! With the warmer weather (hopefully continuing), I would like to remind you about sun protection and would request that sun hats are sent when appropriate. Sun cream should be sent in or single application cream applied before school please. Please advise us of any special arrangements. Summer dresses or shorts are suitable now and sandals are acceptable. Trainers are to be reserved for PE please unless in school (black) colour. Many thanks.

## INFANT CLASS NEWS

### Dear families,

Welcome back to the infant class. We hope you had a lovely Easter. We are looking forward to our new summer topic all about 'Space and our planet' and all of the exciting things that we have planned. We would also like to welcome Miss Aisling Reid to the classroom. She is our St Lukes PGCE trainee teacher and we are all really looking forward to working with her.

For our topic we are going to be finding out about our solar system and some of the planets in it. We will also be looking at why our planet is so special and this will lead into the history of our planet next term. We will be looking in a very simple way at the planned mission to Mars and how they are hoping to create places to grow plants. We will look at what plants need to grow and why they do not grow in space.

Literacy will be made up of a selection of fiction, non-fiction and poetry as well as more of a focus on spellings, grammar and punctuation. Maths will be the progression of counting, problem solving and number facts. We will look at shapes and measures, money and time.

For RE Mrs Attwood will be covering Christianity and 'me, my family and friends'. Also a continuation of our PHSE topics about Health and Growth, Safety and friendships.

### **Class routines:**

The infants will need a **PE** kit on a Tuesday (this includes a school t-shirt, dark blue or black shorts and some shoes suitable for running and games.) It will be important that children have the appropriate clothing this term as we are looking at athletics and sports day activities. We will be having Pro-coaching covering athletics on a Tuesday and we will be swimming on a Monday afternoon. Children will need a costume, towel and a bag for wet things. Please don't send in shampoos etc as we will be very tight on time. The children will have the chance to rinse off as they get out of the pool.

The children will also need to bring in their reading folders daily and we ask that the children read at home as often as they can. You are welcome to come and change their books if you would like to but we do ask that children read their books at least 2 or 3 times before you change them and that they stick to their book band colour unless a change is agreed by a teacher. We also put lots of notices and letters in bags so please check them regularly so that you don't miss any messages.

Snacks: The children are allowed to bring in a morning snack. We will provide fruit for free and parents are able to pre-order milk cartons if you would like your child to have milk in the mornings. We will be asking that any other snack that the children bring in for playtime is a *healthy one.* We are promoting healthy eating a n d children will be allowed to have fruit or a fruit based snack, a wholemeal, flapjack or muesli bar or cheese, cheesy strings etc. No sweets, or crisps please. chocolate Children will be asked to save these until lunchtime. If you have any questions about snacks then please just ask.

## **JUNIOR NEWS**

### Dear families

I hope you all had a lovely Easter break and are now ready for the summer term. This term is quite long but very busy. There are many sporting events such as sports day, Oceanfest and bike ability. All the juniors will be going to Rosemoor, as part of our science/topic work and Year 6 have their London trip. We will also have an art week and topic day later in the term.

In two weeks time we will have SATS week, which year 6 have been working very hard for. This will be an assessment week for all the children but also a chance for them to undertake an extended personal project. This year, each child can choose a forest/jungle to research as a case study. Year 6 will start a London project in preparation for their trip. Throughout the afternoons that week we will run some inter house sporting competitions as well. We will also be running breakfast club that week, for year

6 only, so they can arrive at school early and have breakfast in a relaxed atmosphere, with their friends (more details to follow).

Much of our literacy this term links well with our topic, through diary and letter writing. We will continue with spelling work every morning. We are also continuing our reading drive with house points for every time your child reads at home (Olivia P. managed to read to an adult 17 times over the Easter break!).

In maths this term we will be working on place value, decimal numbers, mental addition and subtraction, further consolidation of written calculation, time, data and rate, and shape and measure.

Our topic this term is forest and jungles. This will include map work, examining ecosystems and their inhabitants, comparing case studies and threats and sustainable management. Our art work will be incorporated into much of this work and be the theme of art week. We will also look at the work of Henri Rousseau.

Plants are the science topic this term. We will investigate germination, growth, parts of the flower and lifecycles. A trip to Rosemoor will consolidate all of these ideas.

Just a few reminders and requests: full school PE kits are required on **Tuesdays** (a sunhat would also be advisable) and swimming kit for **Mondays.** If your child is unable to take part due to medical reasons, please provide a note or leave a message. Please can all school uniform be named, especially jumpers (our jumper box is constantly overflowing).

Further details of trips and visits will follow. We look forward to seeing you later in the term for parents evening or at one of our events.
